I am sympathetic to CNN on your frequent turnover of Trump-supporting commentators. I agree you should have them on but here's the problem: Trump is a liar and a bigot and his supporters have to follow that. Otherwise, Trump will turn on them. I don't see much use in having Never Trumpers on. They're intelligent and genuine conservatives but represent a very small part of the Republican Party. I doubt that they ever get control of their party back.

I also don't like the CNN practice of having journalists and partisan commentators on the same panel. It's not fair to the journalists. It's harder to see them as objective when they are thrown in with people who have an obvious point of view. Maybe you could separate them so it is clear that one group is journalists and the other group is political folks.
